"The 2023-2026 Strategic Plan is one of many components with equal efforts on membership, business and professional development, financial stability, and economic development," she said. "We've been blessed to see return on reputation ('ROR'), termed by our members as 'WHY US'. The driving force of our success is us."

## Reaching with ribbons

MILTON - Looking to be noticed? Allow the Central PA Chamber of Commerce to bring the ribbon and the scissors.

Ribbon cutting ceremonies have long been a benefit that any member can take advantage of; there's often a reason to celebrate! It could be a new business, new ownership, new products/services, or an anniversary.

Whatever the occasion, it could put several thousand eyes on your business/organization!

Year after year, the Central PA Chamber's Facebook page is reaching new record highs. In 2022, it had more than 102,000 page reaches. Through the first five months of this year, it has recorded nearly 59,000. This current pace will put the Chamber's Facebook page ahead 40,000 page reaches over last year!

What seems to be the recent boon? It's not paid advertising. The Central PA Chamber doesn't pay a dime. It's from ribbon cuttings. There have been six ribbon cutting ceremonies through the first five months of the year, and four of the occasions have landed in the top seven when it comes to page reaches, totaling nearly 16,000. Collectively, ribbon cuttings account for almost a third of all page reaches for the year.

So, if you're looking to grow your business or organization, you may need to look at cuts, a ribbon cutting that is.

"The atmosphere around ribbon cutting ceremonies has generally been good over the years, but lately, it's been electric," said Jeff Shaffer, the Chamber's Communication Director, who organizes ribbon cuttings with members. "We plan our ceremonies at least six weeks out, so don't delay if you're thinking about having one."



Tickets will be mailed, if requested, by providing a self-addressed stamped envelope.



As the premier touring musical representative for the United States Army, this internationally acclaimed organization travels thousands of miles each year presenting a variety of music to enthusiastic audiences throughout the nation and abroad. Through these concerts, the field band fosters the support of the American people for members of the armed forces and supports diplomatic efforts around the world. The Concert Band and Soldiers' Chorus are the oldest and largest of The U.S. Army Field Band's performing components. Founded in 1946 and 1957, respectively, these two ensembles combine to present joint concerts on their national tours. They have performed in all 50 states and 30 foreign countries for audiences totaling hundreds of millions.

The 60-member Concert Band and 29-member Soldiers' Chorus perform regularly in some of the most famous concert halls in the world, and just as often in the humblest auditoriums in the smallest of communities. 
