Thank you to everyone who attended and especially our hosts, Collen and Matt!



Lewisburg YMCA Offers Free Program for Those with Fall Risk

A Matter of Balance Helps Participants Manage and Prevent Falls



LEWISBURG – The Lewisburg YMCA, in cooperation with the Union-Snyder Agency on Aging, Inc., will offer *A Matter of Balance*, a program for local residents aged 60 and up who are interested in improving flexibility, balance, and strength, and have restricted their activities because of concerns about falling. The program will be offered free of charge thanks to funds made available by the Pennsylvania Department of Aging.

The program will be led by A Matter of Balance certified instructor and Lewisburg YMCA personal trainer Olivia Conklin. Participants will meet at the Lewisburg YMCA every Monday and Wednesday from noon to 2 PM August 7 through September 4. Eligible participants should be ambulatory, able to problem solve, and have concerns about falling. After completing the program, participants can hope to regain independence and restore confidence when it comes to physical activity. Conklin stated, "Many older adults experience a fear of falling. People who develop this fear often limit their activities, which can result in physical weakness, making the risk of falling even greater. A Matter of Balance is a program designed to reduce the fear of falling and increase activity levels among older adults."

They learned about savings, loans, credit and debit cards, mobile deposit, cardvalet, using the coin machine to count their piggy bank funds and how members help each other by saving and borrowing locally. Each child took home a goodie bag with information to share with parents and a way to turn paper into real money.

Skyler Storey, Member Champion, and the newest member of our team took photos. Brenda Raker, President and CEO, led the tour and talked about the history of credit unions and Pinpoint specifically. As well as how the credit union members help each other through the process of saving and borrowing locally. Ashley Hunter, Member Lending Advocate, talked to the kids about deposits and savings and demonstrated cash recyclers and coin machine transactions. Jody Cutchall, Financial Services Specialist, talked about debit and credit cards and money movement through mobile banking and ACH. She demonstrated a mobile deposit and talked about her career at Pinpoint. Devin Fagnano, VP of Operations, spoke to the children about loans and credit and how it pays to maintain a good payment history.



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

# Free Electrical Safety Training



Central PA – The Innovative Manufacturers' Center (IMC), Inc. is excited to announce its continued partnership with The Manufacturers' Association to support training in electrical safety in central and southcentral Pennsylvania through December 2024. The Association was awarded a \$157,833 training grant by the Federal Susan Harwood Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), which will focus on manufacturing but also other industrial sectors.
