


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## United Way's Annual Day of Action Returns to Make a Difference.

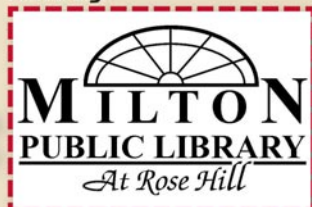
