Please know that you are perfect just the way you are and you are enough!





Lewisburg YMCA Offering AI Program for Kids

The Y, Susquehanna Kids and DegenSTEAM Academy are teaming up to offer this free learning opportunity

LEWISBURG - The Lewisburg YMCA is partnering with Susquehanna Kids of Bloomsburg and DegenSTEAM Academy to offer a free, one-hour artificial intelligence learning experience for local youth. The program is supported by the DegenSTEAM Academy, a new initiative of the 1994 Charles B. Degenstein Foundation, as well as a PA Smart Grant. The session will take place Wednesday, Dec. 17, 2025, from 4 to 5 p.m. at the Lewisburg YMCA.

The hands-on program introduces kids to foundational AI concepts using lessons from trusted organizations including LEGO® Education, Google, Minecraft Education and others, all curated on a single platform by Code.org. The goal is to help students better understand the technology shaping the world around them.

The workshop is age-appropriate, interactive and focused on the safe, responsible use of AI. Students do not need to bring any devices or materials, as all equipment will be provided. During the session, students will explore:

- What AI actually is and what it is not
- How people use AI in everyday life
- Why creative problem-solving, not computers, continues to drive innovation

"Helping kids build confidence with emerging technology is an important part of preparing them for the future," said Carolyn Reitz, Youth Director at the Lewisburg YMCA. "This program gives students a fun and welcoming introduction to AI, while also emphasizing safety, creativity and curiosity."

The program, open to kids ages 5-15, is designed for beginners and aims to ensure students feel informed and empowered, not overwhelmed.

\$12,000 Raised in the Second Annual Veterans Benefit Voyage

NSHR is thankful to everyone who supported this fundraiser - from buying a ticket to ride the train to purchasing a sweatshirt or hat - each one contributed to making this such a success and giving back to our Nation's Veterans.

In 2024, NSHR dedicated two of its locomotives to the brave members of the United States Military. LVRR 9052 is the Veterans Unit and LVRR 9050 is the Memorial Unit.

It has been the NSHR's goal to use the Military units to not only bring awareness and a reminder of the sacrifice of the United States Military members (in the viewing of the units in regular freight service), but also to be utilized to raise money for nonprofit organizations that support and help Veterans. This past summer, North Shore opened an application process to qualifying, nonprofit, Veteran organizations.

Central PA Wreaths Across America (WAA)

Several years ago, a small group of Central Pennsylvania individuals formed a consortium of like-minded people to HONOR, REMEMBER, and TEACH future generations about the brave men and women that signed their name on the dotted line to protect and defend our freedoms. Each December, through Wreaths Across America, 30 local communities gather to lay wreaths and say the name of each Veteran buried in participating cemeteries. The mission is growing each year! Together, they work as one to raise funds for this endeavor, promoting the vision to include more communities as we draw the region together to pay tribute to Central PA heroes. WAA's main goal is to ensure that veterans buried in cemeteries that have joined their consortium receive wreaths during the nationwide Wreaths Across America Day. They also promote the national campaign of REMEMBER the fallen, HONOR those who serve, and TEACH our children the value of freedom.

Heroes & Horses (H&H)

Heroes & Horses was developed to serve our Veterans. They work to help improve lives of our Nation's heroes through connection with horses. Whether it's through riding (which is optional) or just hanging out and grooming, H&H has developed this program to assist Veterans and show just what horses have to offer - in ways of healing the mind, body, and soul. H&H uses their horses to help Veterans identify their anxiety (sometimes when they don't know they have it). 2025 is H&H's 10-Year Anniversary. In those ten years, their program has saved nine Veterans' lives. No Veteran is charged for their services and the H&H's horse farm sets aside funds for meals for Veterans.



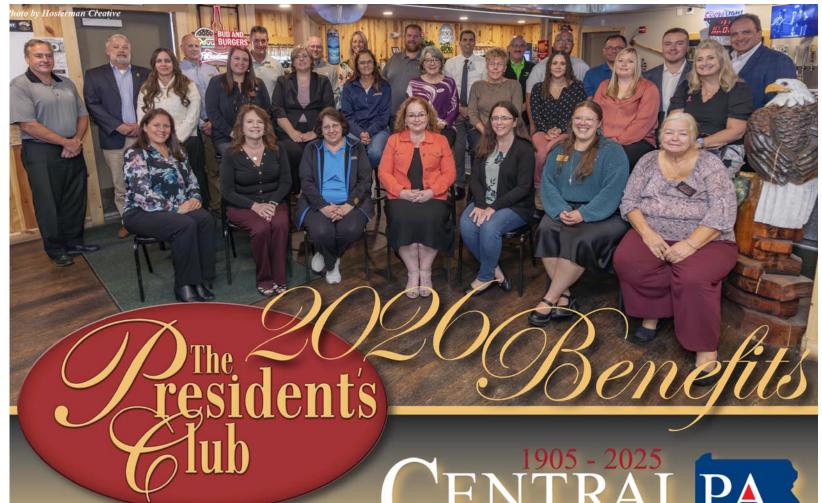
