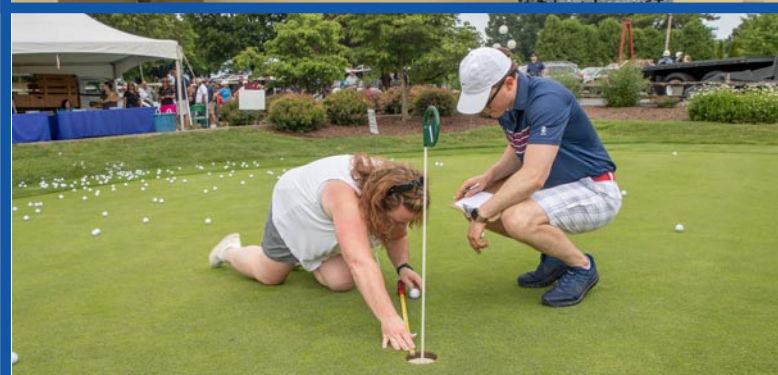
245 specially numbered golf balls were hoisted by crane, courtesy of T-Ross Brothers Construction, and dropped onto the practice green near the clubhouse.

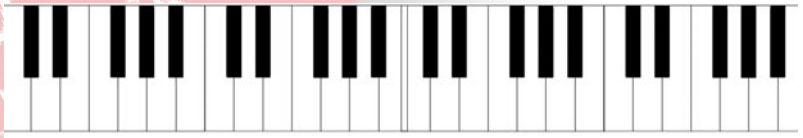
